









WHAT ARE THE TIMINGS?:

We also offer morning (6:00 hours pick-up) and afternoon (14:30pm pick-up) game drives. Our evening game drive, with dinner at the Jafuta Conservatory Reserve, picks up at 15:35pm. In total drives last between 3 and 3.5 hours.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Wear neutral colours. Bring a camera and, if you have them, binoculars. The vehicles can take a maximum of 10 guests but we have multiple vehicles so can accommodate groups.

GAME VIEWING IN THE ZAMBEZI NATIONAL PARK.

A game drive offers you the opportunity to cover more ground in the comfort of one of our specially modified game vehicles. You will have ample opportunities to observe and photograph wildlife as we drive through Zambezi National Park, home to four of the Big Five, along with a diverse array of other game species. We will stop to point out birds, flora, fauna and animal tracks. Our guides will regale you with stories of the bush, they'll let you know which plants you can use for toilet paper, how you can tell the age of an elephant dung and what branch to use to brush your teeth. We'll also get out of the vehicles to enjoy some snacks and a drink by the Zambezi river.

NIGHT GAME DRIVES

A night game drive is a special way to see some of the more nocturnal creatures of the Zambezi National Park. With our tailor-made red game spot lights we'll be able to see the game without annoying or agitating them.

Dinner afterwards will be at the Jafuta Game Drive in Victoria Falls and guests will be dropped back at their hotels afterwards.

Frequently asked questions

WHAT SHOULD I EXPECT TO SEE?

Although we can't guarantee sightings we often see elephants, buffalos, giraffe, hippo, several species of plains game. While less common we have seen lions and leopards. Guides will also talk to guests about the vegetation and the 449 bird species in the Zambezi National Park - A premium bird watching destination.

IS THERE AN AGE LIMIT?

There are no age restrictions on the trip. If you have infants /toddlers (children under the age of 4) you should consult your agent or any Shearwater sales consultant on point of booking

ARE THERE AN RESTRICTIONS ON NUMBERS?

For the game drive we take a maximum of 10 people. A game drive needs at least two passengers to take place.

WHO ARE THE GUIDES?

We use only the best Zimbabwean professional guides and Zimbabwean guides are some of the best in the world. The process to become a professional guide (and qualified to lead walking safaris) takes four years of training. All our professional guides are licensed to carry a firearm and do so on the walking safaris. Guides also carry a first aid kit and a radio to communicate with Shearwater HQ.

WHAT INSURANCE DO YOU HAVE?

Shearwater has public liability insurance of \$2m USD, underwritten by Lloyds of London in place for all activities.

WHAT SHOULD I WEAR?

Wear neutral colours (no bright colours), with comfortable walking shoes. The mornings and evenings can be chilly so bring something warm to wear.

WHAT SHOULD I BRING?

A camera and binoculars. Warm clothing and, if during the rainy season, a rain jacket.

WHAT SHOULD I LEAVE BEHIND?

Any valuables and food.

WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE TRIP?

For morning drives guests get a breakfast of Tea/Coffee and water and with a side of freshly baked muffins. For the afternoon game drives dry snacks, beers, soft drinks and water are served. For the evening game drive a three course dinner is served.

We also include a fleece poncho to keep you warm in the winter and/or early mornings.
